



What is the National Advocacy Center (NAC)?

The National Advocacy Center (NAC) is operated by the Department of Justice, Executive Office for United States Attorneys (EOUSA). The facility is located on the campus of the University of South Carolina. Over 20,000 personnel are trained annually in advocacy skills and management of legal operations.

Where can I get a schedule of NAC course offerings?

You can log in to JTMS and look for courses under the "Office of Legal Education" subject area, or you can check the NACs course offering page at <https://www.justice.gov/usao/training/course-offerings/schedule-2017>.

How do I register for NAC courses?

To register, find the course offering you are looking for in JTMS by searching the catalog by the course name. You can either request registration, add the course to your to-do list, or recommend the course to someone else.

How will I know if I get selected for a course?

All NAC courses require a recommendation from the ATF NAC coordinator who ranks registration requests and sends them forward to the Office of Legal Education through JTMS. As your request moves through the approval process, you will receive notifications from JTMS letting you know your registration status. If selected you will receive reporting instructions from the NAC.
